Dr Hendry is the National Clinical Lead for Quality and the Long Term Conditions Collaborative Clinical Lead with the Scottish Government.

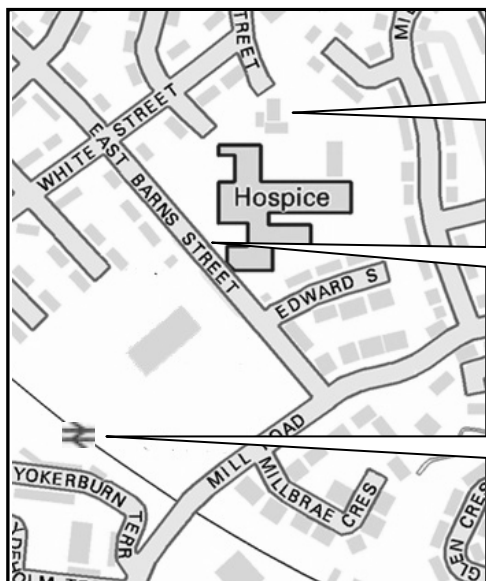
