

The Assisted Suicide (Scotland) Bill would provide a means for certain people who are approaching the end of their lives to seek assistance to end their lives at a time of their own choosing.

It would provide protection against criminal and civil liability for those providing such assistance, provided that the processes set out in the Bill have been followed.

There are three stages to the process that a person seeking an assisted suicide would be required to follow: a preliminary declaration, a first request and a second request.

There are then a number of provisions concerning the act of suicide itself and the role of licensed facilitators.

My Life, My Death, My Choice is the campaign to support the Assisted Suicide (Scotland) Bill, which is currently being considered by the Scottish Parliament. The Campaign believes people must be able to make their own choices about their life and death.

Care Not Killing is an alliance of individuals and organisations with the aims of (1) promoting more and better palliative care, (2) ensuring that existing laws against euthanasia and assisted suicide are not weakened or repealed, and (3) influencing the balance of public opinion against any further weakening of the law.

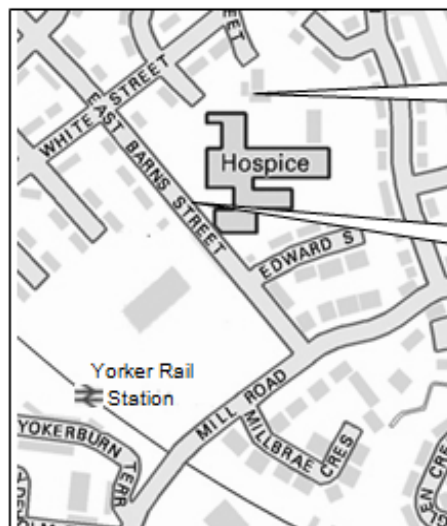
